I could not count the times I have heard someone say "at least I will have lots of company." The tragic fact is that they could be more right than they realize. I have never been one to preach that we are going to Hell for our transgressions as much as to preach that we can be forgiven our trespasses when we humble ourselves, ask for forgiveness and accept Jesus' sacrifice on the cross as our means of receiving salvation. ## **LUMC Mission Team Updates**

Your LUMC Mission Teams have been busy with a number of projects these past few months. All church members are welcome to get involved in any of these efforts. Volunteer – get to know your fellow church members, have some fun, and put your talents and faith into action!

<u>Community Outreach</u> – Terry and Jaquie Holshouser, Co-Chairs. Team members have been busy helping individuals from our church and in the community with a variety of projects ranging from changing batteries in smoke detectors to remounting air vents. In addition, work has been done in The Well (youth meeting room) at church that sustained water damage due to onslaught of rain the last month or so. More work is needed. In addition, team members helped with efforts to put up the high tunnel greenhouse behind the Lexington High School. Plans are also underway to assist an individual needing help removing tree limbs and storm debris in her backyard.

<u>Lazarus Table</u> – Our youth group volunteered to help serve the meal for the homeless at the UMC Grand Ave Temple in Kansas City on Sunday June 28. The group also attended their church services as well. LUMC church will need volunteers to help at Grand Avenue Temple on <u>August 9<sup>th</sup></u>. If you would like to be part of this rewarding experience, sign up in the narthex, or contact Lynda Johnson for more information. Volunteers carpool, and generally leave at 8 a.m., and return by 2:30 p.m.

<u>Heifer International</u> – Ashley Zweifel, Chair. Our children are raising money for this mission through the "noisy offering" held the last Sunday of each month. The Heifer International mission funds are used to purchase small animals (chickens, pigs, goats, etc) for impoverished families in Central America and Africa to create a sustainable food supply and potential income. To date, our children have raised over \$380, and will be collecting through the end of the year.

<u>Migrant Farm Workers Outreach</u> – LUMC will assist with distributing food, blankets, and clothing to the migrant farmworkers of Lafayette County on <u>Mondays September 14 and October 12.</u> Beginning time for volunteers is 3:30 – 4 p.m. and finishing by 7 – 7:30 p.m. Distribution is held in the parking lot of UMOS Head Start (former school district Success Center/Skating Rink). Beginning in August, LUMC will collect bags of dry red beans and white rice (not instant) to donate, in addition to brown paper grocery sacks. <u>SERVE 2015</u> – The last few years, United Methodist Churches across our State have joined efforts in September to make a difference in their community through various acts of service and efforts to reach out and show we care. This year churches are free to select their own date. <u>Our LUMC SERVE 2015</u> will be held on <u>October 4<sup>th</sup></u>, with October 11<sup>th</sup> as a backup date in the event of inclement weather. 
