


ENJOY CANDLELIGHT HISTORIC CHURCH TOURS - DOWNTOWN LEXINGTON DEC. 5

People come to see Lexington's magnificent historic churches year round, but these houses of worship are especially beautiful when decorated for the holidays.

Three of Lexington's downtown historic worship sites will open their doors to the public from 6 to 8 p.m. on Saturday evening, December 5th, 2015 in conjunction with the other 1st ever "YuleFest" activities that will also take place in the downtown area. These church spires that highlight the Lexington skyline have become a symbol of Lexington's distinguished heritage and beauty. Outside luminaries will attract visitors to these sites, where they will enjoy tours, seasonal music and fellowship.

Congregational members will act as hosts to greet visitors and answer questions about the history of the churches. This free- to- the- public walking tour includes the following worship sites: the Christ Episcopal Church located at 1300 Franklin Avenue, the Presbyterian Disciples Church located at 10th and Franklin Avenue and the Second Baptist Church located at 1201 Main Street.

So put the date, December 5th on your calendars and plan to stroll down our lovely downtown streets and visit these churches dressed for the season and warmed by candlelight for what will be an enchanting evening. You can also add another historical gem to your evening itinerary by visiting the Battle of Lexington State Historic Site from 6 pm to 8 pm., where you will enjoy a decorated Anderson House along with Christmas desserts and music. 



BETHLEHEM

Make a mobile to remind you of Jesus' birth.


What you need:

- Paper plate
- Hole punch
- Thin blue ribbon
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Yellow craft foam
- Marker

What you do:

- 1. With the paper plate upside down, punch evenly spaced holes along the rim. Gently fold the plate and punch a hole in the center.
- 2. Cut pieces of ribbon, thread them through the holes as desired and tie the ribbons securely.
- 3. Trace several small stars and one larger star on the foam and cut them out. Punch a hole atop a point of each star.
- 4. Tie one small star to each outer-rim ribbon.
- 5. Thread a longer ribbon through the center hole and tie the large star to the other end.
- 6. Write a verse on the plate or large star. Hang the mobile from the ceiling with another piece of blue ribbon.
