

ANNUAL CONFERENCE DEFINED

The annual conference is the basic body of the church. The term dates back to the early days of the Methodist movement when founder John Wesley established a conference to instruct and supervise Methodist preachers. We use "annual conference" to reference both the body and the gathering of the body. The annual conference approves candidates for ordination and handles all matters concerning clergy. The annual conference equips its local churches for ministry and provides a connection for ministry beyond the local church.

The annual conference meets yearly and may be called to special session for specific purposes. The bishop presides over annual conference and sets the time of meeting. Membership includes clergy members and an equal number of laypersons elected by a charge conference, designated as members due to their leadership roles.

The annual conference has many powers and duties, including the credentialing and admittance of clergy, ratifying constitutional amendments and electing clergy and lay members of General, jurisdictional or central conferences. It is responsible for guiding the mission and ministry of the church within its boundaries and structuring and funding ministries and agencies to accomplish its purpose.

2018 ANNUAL CONFERENCE OFFERINGS

Our church will be making a small donation to the three special offerings at annual conference this year:

Mozambique Sustainability Reboot

This offering will relaunch the Mozambique Initiative's efforts to create opportunities for church-going entrepreneurs through sustainability projects. In 2012, the Mozambique Initiative added sustainability as a key component to our partnership. After reviewing projects completed during the 2012-2017 program, we believe the best way to reboot is by focusing on smaller projects (\$400 or less) for individual entrepreneurs. The goal for this offering is to provide microloans for at least 25 entrepreneurs in Mozambique.

Pathway Out of Poverty

Gifts shared in this offering will be distributed for the work of administering our Pathway out of Poverty initiative focused on literacy. Your gift to this initiative will help us equip local churches to connect with schools in their communities and provide them with relationship-building resources. Research shows that children who struggle to read in first grade are 88 percent more likely to struggle in grade FOUR. And those who struggle in fourth grade are four times more likely to drop out of school. With this offering we seek to break cycles of poverty by connecting with our schools.

Puerto Rico Disaster Response

The Methodist Church of Puerto Rico continues to rebuild following the devastation of Hurricane Maria in the fall of 2017. Thirty-eight churches were damaged with 10 nearly destroyed. Yet, the people of Puerto Rico have remained strong. Your gift will help rebuild a Methodist health clinic on the island of Vieques. This clinic will be the primary point of care for the island's population of 12,000 people—care that is desperately needed as residents wait a projected two years for electricity to be fully restored.

The LUMC adopted a simplified structure of Church Officials several years ago. We still have some confusion what that means. Here is a brief explanation.

What is a simplified structure?

A simplified structure pulls several administrative committees into one leadership board. The separate committees of Church Council, Finance, Trustees, and Staff-Parish Relations come together into one Administration Team. This Team consists of nine members, three each Finance, Trustees, and SPR, nominated by the Committee on Lay Leadership. Ex Officio Members with vote are representatives from UM Men, UM Women, and UM Youth. In addition, the pastor and treasurer are ex officio members without vote. Staff cannot serve on the Team.

Persons on the Ad Team serve a term of 3 years. During that time they are expected to make every effort to attend Ad Team Meetings, held every other month (odd months of the year) on the third Monday at 5:30 pm. Meetings are open to all church members, unless they are closed for personnel matters.

Although the Ad Team works as a whole, three individuals each are designated as Trustees, Finance, and Staff-Parish Relations to fulfill requirements in the Book of Discipline. When decisions are made regarding Trustee issues the entire Team functions as Trustees, etc.

The intent of the simplified structure is straightforward: by moving people off committees, we encourage more time for ministry and mission. The underlying assumption is that we don't want to say to someone, "We're so glad that you're excited about Jesus and your faith walk! Now, let's put you on a committee!" As we seek to be in ministry with busy families, we don't want to burden them with lots of administrative meetings and duties. We would prefer that their time be spent in worship and in service.

With this model our decision-making process is streamlined. No longer does someone need to consult with several different groups before moving forward with a new ministry initiative. Instead, ministry ideas can be presented at one time, with all of the decision-making people in the room. Not only that, but every decision concerning our ministry is made with all of the players sitting together, focusing on the mission of the church.

About reStart —- Where Our Sleeping Bags Go!

Since 1981, reStart's goal has remained the same—to end homelessness in Kansas City. This ambitious goal has made reStart a leader in innovative approaches to ending homelessness. Their innovation has opened doors to all homeless persons in need.

In 36 years, the overnight shelter turned non-profit organization has grown and served more than 28,406 homeless individuals, including 11,174 children and youth.

reStart provides housing and supportive services to help homeless men, women, youth and families move toward independence and self-sufficiency with the goal of ending homelessness in our community.

reStart is the only homeless agency in Kansas City serving all homeless populations—singles, couples, gay, straight and trans-gendered individuals, and unaccompanied youth ages 12-18, as well as non-traditional families, persons with HIV/AIDS, and individuals recently released from prison or from psychiatric hospitalization.

reStart provides services free of charge. We admit clients with active substance abuse disorders or mental health problems as long as they are not a danger to themselves or others, and we don't require clients to participate in religious services as a condition of housing. Our mission

reStart's mission is to provide housing and supportive services for homeless youth, families, women and men to end homelessness in our community.


