

Easter is coming! As we move into our 2<sup>nd</sup> week of Lent I will be doing a sermon series on some of the sayings of Jesus about his impending death and resurrection. As I shared last Sunday at Grace my theme is "Jesus said it and I believe it!" In this culture we live in it seems we do not know who to trust. Public officials have let us down. Pro athletes are involved in everything from domestic violence to drug addictions to even murder. There have been people of faith who have done great harm by their actions and attitudes. There are times when we wonder if we can even trust ourselves. I find that in the words of Christ there are never any contradictions. His message was always the same regardless of someone's importance or social stature. The one common theme is that He, meaning Jesus, was going to Jerusalem where he would be arrested, put on trial, and be killed. He also said that in three days He would rise from the dead. That is a story I never get tired of hearing!

I want to update the churches on the direction we are moving in. It has been approved by both church boards to move towards being more lay-led churches. What does this mean? It means that I will be doing the preaching and most pastoral care while allowing the laity to run the day to day operations and ministries of the church. Under the direction of our new position of church coordinator there will be teams organized and trained to do the various ministries. Our 5 teams are connectional, relational, education, worship, and missions. It will be the church coordinators job to help train and provide resources to equip these teams. It is our hope to involve every person in both churches to be in some type of learning environment and also in a place of service to the church or community. This can all be wrapped up in two words "accountable discipleship." I believe this is the best vehicle to move our churches forward with a sense of ownership and excitement. Lexington UMC has hired Sarah Black to be their church coordinator and she is doing a great job. We are still in the process of discerning and praying for who our church coordinator will be for Grace UMC. In the coming weeks we will hear much more on what our process will look like and function as. I think this is very exciting! If you would like to discuss this with me feel free to stop by the office. As always, I give thanks to God for each and every one of you! God Bless!

Ad Team members present were: Powers Alder, Nancy Oles, Brent Zweifel, Larry Johnson, Rev. Terry Cook, Lynda Johnson, Terry Holshouser, Jamie Lynn, Sarah Black, Steve Fuller, Janea Fuller, Suzanne Hoeppner and Mable Hawkins. Powers called the meeting to order and offered prayer. Powers asked for approval of the minutes from the January 18 meeting. There being no additions or corrections they were approved with Suzanne Hoeppner making motion to accept and Lynda Johnson seconded the motion. Treasurer Suzanne gave a detailed report of the finances. The new sound booth that is being constructed will be paid for with a \$3,000 gift from the conference and the remaining money will come from Dorothy Bryant Memorial fund. The van insurance, license and insurance has been taken care of for one year. The youth were able to take it to Springfield for WOW weekend and it ran good. Jamie asked about the way gas for the van is purchased. Normally the person driving it would fill it up and then could be reimbursed for the amount. The van was purchased for \$3,000 and there was an account balance of \$2,700 from a previous van account. Pastor Cook asked for donations from the congregation to make up the difference. Sarah Black asked about driver qualifications. Minimum age is 25, and maximum age is 70; no CDL required, but driver must take a required test online for the insurance company. New business. Finance Chair, Suzanne reported that the church is in good shape financially. Higginsville Grace church has rented their parsonage as Sarah has moved, so they will be responsible for half of the Lexington parsonage utilities. Trustee Chair Roger McFadden, reported nothing new, everything is running smoothly. The media center project is looking good and thanks goes to all the men who have worked long, hard hours to get it completed. Roger reported that one of the furnaces in church had blown a fuse, but was an easy fix and when weather gets warmer it will be permanently fixed with a covering over some wires. Sarah Black reported on the discipleship meeting. To quote Sarah "things are rolling and looking good." Sarah is not through yet. Her couples class is going good. In absence of Rowdy and Annie Yates, Pastor Terry reported that the youth are doing okay. They are meeting on Sunday evenings with about 8 kids enrolled. They hosted the Mystery dinner on Saturday evening and it was great fun for those in attendance. Good food and good fellowship. Jamie Lynn reported on the PPR Committee. Since Sarah Thompson is no longer employed as a part-time assistant, Jamie suggested that a church coordinator be hired for LUMC. This would be someone to assist Pastor Terry. (Higginsville is also going to hire a coordinator for Grace.) Jamie suggest approximately eight hours per week with a salary of \$10 to \$14.25 per hour. Sarah Black was suggested as the person to be the coordinator, as it is what she has been doing the past several months. After discussion, a motion by Jamie and seconded by Terry Holshouser was made. Motion carried with a salary of \$14.25 per hour. This will help relieve Terry of some stress and will be a big help to everyone. Pastor Terry suggested that the church purchase a portable baptismal. He had a flyer that showed the portable ones. Pastor was familiar with one that was in a previous church he pastored. The cost to be \$2,200 plus shipping with the money coming from memorials. After discussion Suzanne made motion to purchase the baptismal and Jamie seconded the motion. Motion carried. Hopefully it will be in place by Palm Sunday when there are five young people going to be confirmed. Pastor said we may want to purchase some white robes for the ones being baptized could use. There will be a pre-conference training in Kearney on March 7. Pastor will drive the van for anyone interested in going. Pastor Terry has one week of vacation planned after Easter and requested another week. Ad council approved. No other business the meeting was adjourned with Powers offering closing prayer.

#### **Indulge for Lent?**

Rather than sacrificing something for Lent — especially something easy and spiritually insignificant, such as chocolate — Patty Kirk, in *Guideposts* magazine, suggests finding new ways to indulge in God's presence. Surely one can do this by having extra devotions or attending Lenten worship services. But Kirk offers these ideas:

- Spend time outdoors, sensing God's magnificence.
- Spend time with others, extending generosity and compassion. Remember Jesus' promise that when you care for others, you care for him (Matthew 25:31-46).
- Pray for the "little things," coming before God in childlike trust and feeling peace.
- Watch attentively for God's answers to prayer, and receive them as reminders of his presence.
- Turn anxiety into prayer. As you frame concerns as prayers and entrust them to God, you "sacrifice" the tendency to wallow in worry.

Use this fun family activity to remember to pray for other people.

#### What you need:

- White index cards (at least six)
- Markers or colored pencils (red, orange, yellow, green, blue and brown)
- M&M's candies

#### What you do:

- 1. On each card, write a group of people to pray for (family members, friends, teachers, sick people, etc.). Use a different color of writing utensil for each card.
- 2. While sitting at a table, divide the M&M's among family members.
- 3. Spread out the cards and explain that each color represents a group of people to pray for. Have each family member choose one candy and consider who they'll pray for.
- 4. Designate one person to start praying aloud. Go around the circle, and have the last person close.
- 5. At the end of that round, eat those M&M's.
- 6. Continue until you've prayed for all the cards. (Make more, if you'd like!)
