Here is their summary: they are a of 35 college students from the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul Minnesota (right on the Mississippi River). Their club is called a Students Today Leaders Forever and they do a spring break trip to a destination city every spring. This year they are headed to Austin, TX and are stopping to do service projects in St. Joseph, MO, Lexington, MO, Tulsa, OK, Oklahoma City, and Temple TX.
