



Our Heartland District is home to several exciting and challenging ministry initiatives. This letter is an invitation to you and your congregation to support these ministries. Our efforts to reclaim a Wesleyan presence on the east side and northeast communities of Kansas City, Missouri, are full of great potential, but come with significant challenges.

It will take longer to create self-sustaining ministries in these communities than our usual church start process. I am inviting you and your congregation to consider including our *True Vine Mission Center* ministries and our new church start in partnership with *Grace United Community Ministries* in your mission and generosity plans for the coming year.

Do you have work/mission teams seeking a fresh project? Do you have people who would give time and talent to these ministries? Would you take a special offering or designate part/all of your Christmas Eve offering to support one of these ministries?

Several churches in the Heartland already have contributed money and persons to share in these ministries.

I am happy to visit with you about ways to get involved or contact the pastors to discuss your involvement.

True Vine Mission Center was a vision of Centennial pastor, David Gilmore, and former Heartland D.S. Kendall Waller. The basic concept was to take the closed Wesley Heights facility at 19th & Hardesty and use it to incubate ministries on the east side of KCMO.

Three ministries are currently housed at True Vine Mission Center: Centennial UMC at True Vine; Kuomba (an African immigrant congregation connected to Central UMC); and a Hispanic congregation which rents space.

Centennial at True Vine conducts several ministries:

- *The Upper Room Summer Program*, an urban core academic program for K-8th grade with 80-100 participants.
- The Reading Nook at True Vine is reading program which focuses on children from Kuomba and other kids in the community.
- *The Hope Hangout at True Vine* will be a collaborative program with East High School to provide young people alternative afterschool activities.
- *Breaking Bread* is a community meal and non-traditional worship experience with a goal of engaging people in the True Vine mission field.


Make this sign to hang on your wall as a daily reminder of God's amazing gift of grace.

What you need:

- White poster board
- Large wooden letters that spell GRACE
- Painter's tape
- Tempura paint
- Paper plates
- Paintbrushes
- Colored pens or markers

What you do:

- 1. Place the poster board on the ground (outside, if possible).
- 2. Put tape on the back of the letters and secure them to the board. No tape should be visible.
- 3. Paint and draw all over the poster board. Be creative with splatters, handprints and so on.
- 4. When paint is dry, remove the letters and hang up the poster.
